### **2006 Master Study Resolution Items Recommended by Legislative Management Committee**

5. Alcohol Laws - to study issues related to state alcohol laws.
6. Caller ID Abuse - to study issues related to spoofing -- caller ID abuse (H.B. 439).
7. Demographic Data Tracking - to study demographic data tracking by the Department of Commerce (2nd Sub. H.B. 236).
8. Discrimination Based on Sexual Orientation - to study discrimination in housing and employment based on sexual orientation.
9. Exchange of Real Estate Data - to study the exchange of commercial real estate data between appraisers and assessors.
10. Exempt Life Insurance Proceeds - to study whether changes are needed to state law to ensure that protections from execution apply to potential debtors who have a properly funded estate plan and own the policy in a living trust or name a trust as beneficiary of their insurance policy.
11. Garnishment - to study garnishment fees and notices.

12. Home Inspection Licensure - to study licensure and registration of the home inspection industry.
13. Insurance Disclosure Requirements - to study requiring the disclosure of the amount or the extent of compensation from an insurer or third party that is received by an insurance producer (S.B. 114).
14. Licensing Laser Surgery - to study the licensure of laser surgery, including laser skin treatments.
15. Licensing of Health and Fire Inspectors - to study licensing of health and fire inspectors who use state-adopted building codes as their inspection standard.
16. Minimum Wage - to study raising the minimum wage (S.B. 43).
17. Minimum Wage Study - to study issues related to the minimum wage.
18. Noncompetition Contracts - to study issues related to employee noncompetition contracts (S.B. 197).
19. Private Club Requirements - to study issues related to private club memberships, including alcohol requirements.
20. Privatizing Workers' Compensation - to study the privatization of the Workers Compensation Fund.
21. Right to Work - to study right to work laws (H.B. 177).
22. Security Personnel Licensing - to study problems in implementing provisions of S.B. 71, Security Personnel Licensing Amendments, 2005 General Session.
23. Time Share Registrations - to study the registration of small time share groups by owners' associations.
24. Uniform Securities Act - to study possible changes to the Utah Uniform Securities Act.

## Reports for 2006 Interim

- **Privately Owned Health Care Organization Task Force:** This task force will complete its second and final year and report to the Business and Labor Committee and Revenue and Taxation Interim Committee before November 30, 2006.
- **Mandatory Obligations on Health Insurers in Title 31A:** In accordance with Section 36-12-5, the Business and Labor Interim Committee will work with the Health and Human Services Committee, subject to the direction of Legislative Management, to direct studies and receive reports regarding mandatory obligations placed on health insurers in Title 31A, Insurance Code.
- **Regulation of General Contractors:** During the 2005 Interim, the Occupational and Professional Licensure Review Committee requested an additional year to review the regulation of general contractors, and to report back to the Business and Labor Interim Committee during the 2006 Interim.
