
UTAH CODE SECTIONS RELATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE REPORT ON WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE

31A-22-1001. Obligation to write workers' compensation insurance.

The Workers' Compensation Fund created under Chapter 33, shall write all workers' compensation insurance for which application is made to the Workers' Compensation Fund. This requirement does not apply to any other insurer.

31A-22-1012. Workers' compensation insurance availability.

(1) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the department shall make rules to monitor the following related to employers who can only obtain workers' compensation insurance pursuant to Section 31A-22-1001 because of an underwriting standard or guideline described in Subsection (2):

- (a) the number of employers;
- (b) the type of employers;
- (c) the underwriting standard or guideline that causes the employer to obtain workers' compensation under Section 31A-22-1001; or
- (d) similar information to the information described in Subsections (1)(a) through (c).

(2) An underwriting standard or guideline described in Subsection (1) includes a standard or guideline regarding:

- (a) premium size;
- (b) class code and risk characteristics;
- (c) payroll and loss experience;
- (d) another factor identified by the department; or
- (e) a combination of the factors listed in Subsections (2)(a) through (d).

31A-22-1013. Department report on workers' compensation.

The department shall report annually to the Business and Labor Interim Committee by no later than its October interim meeting on the following:

- (1) the cost and availability of workers' compensation insurance coverage in Utah;
- (2) the results of the monitoring provided for in Section 31A-22-1012;
- (3) the size of the residual market as a percentage of the overall workers' compensation insurance market in Utah;
- (4) which workers' compensation insurers in the state are the top ten that held the largest market shares of Utah's workers' compensation insurance market during the three calendar years preceding the report; and
- (5) any recommendations of the department to the Legislature to improve the cost and availability of workers' compensation to Utah businesses.
