State statute requires a report annually to the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Interim Committee to include the following information:

- ~ Final state daily incarceration rate
- ~ Proposed jail contracting rate
- ~ Proposed jail reimbursement rate
- ~ The counties who participate in the program
- ~ The number of state inmates in county jails
- ~ The number of probation and parole inmates housed in county jails

## FINAL STATE DAILY INCARCERATION RATE

The state daily incarceration rate, defined in statute, means an incarceration rate that includes the actual expenses of the Department of Corrections, including: executive overhead, administrative overhead, transportation overhead, division overhead, motor pool expenses, medical expenses, mental health expenses, dental expenses, and a straight line capital depreciation, over a 40-year period, for prison facilities of the department. To arrive at an average daily incarceration rate, the rates for the prior three years are averaged.

## JAIL CONTRACTING & REIMBURSEMENT RATES

Proposed jail contracting rate = 70% of \$80.35 = \$56.25 per day

Proposed jail reimbursement rate = 50% of \$80.35 = \$40.18 per day

### JAIL CONTRACTING

During Fiscal Year 2009, the Department of Corrections housed an average of 1,289 state inmates in county jails.

The two largest contracting counties were Beaver and Washington, with 355 and 124 state inmates, respectively.

### JAIL REIMBURSEMENT

A total of 1,065 probation and parole inmates were housed in county jails during Fiscal Year 2009. A total of \$10,519,000 was billed and paid to counties for these offenders.

The two largest amounts paid were Salt Lake County (\$2,830,000) and Weber County (\$1,985,000).
