¹ Licenses for on-premise beer retailers (taverns) and package agencies are also subject to a quota. While a package agency license is not considered to be a sublicense under a resort license, the resort licensee does hold a separate package agency license. The resort licensee does not hold an on-premise beer retailer (tavern) license. The resort licensee also holds a resort spa sublicense which is not subject to a quota since it may only be granted in connection with a resort license. The number of resort licenses may not at any time aggregate more than four.

² These are new licenses not subject to existing quotas.
