

Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee

Motions – 2016 General Session

February 11, 2016

- Motion 1: I move to transfer the \$750,000 ongoing from the Education Fund and any associated nonlapsing balances for the Statewide Online Education Program from the State Board of Education – Utah State Office of Education – Business Services section into a new appropriation unit within the State Office of Education line item.
- Motion 2: I move to approve the transfer of an additional \$65,000, for a total of \$250,000 ongoing, from the Grades 1-12 program to the Centennial Scholarships Program which is now a Related to Basic School Program.
- Motion 3: I move to approve an increase in the allocation to Educator Licensing from the Professional Practices Restricted Subfund of \$265,000 one-time in FY 2016 and \$265,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2017 as outlined in the document titled, "[Utah State Office of Education Educator Licensing](#)" and posted online under the "Meeting Materials" section for the Monday, February 1, 2016 meeting of the Public education Appropriations Subcommittee.
- Motion 4: I move to approve that the State Board of Education may charge a fee to local education agencies to use the ASPIRE student accounting system. The fee is estimated at \$4.51 per student and an anticipated quantity of 183,000 for a total estimated revenue of approximately \$825,300.
- Motion 5: I move to approve the following intent language:

Teacher Supplies & Materials

The Legislature intends that the Utah State Board of Education adopts a distribution mechanism for the Teacher Supplies and Materials appropriation that considers different cost structures for individual teacher needs and experience levels. The Legislature further intends that Local Education Agencies (LEAs) provide a 25 percent match in order to receive an allocation from the program.

Revenue from SAGE Licensing

The Legislature intends that the Utah State Board of Education use any nonlapsing balances generated from the licensing of Student Assessment of Growth and Excellence (SAGE) questions to other states to develop additional assessment questions and provide professional learning for Utah educators.
