Please JUST VOTE NO to Utah's new Sumsion06 Adopted Final U.S. Congressional Map at next week's Legislative Session. Your NO vote WILL MATTER. If citizens can get enough NO votes in the Legislature we have a plan of action.

This adopted map, dubbed the "pizza slice" plan, divides up communities of interest including rural and urban citizens, and purposefully dilutes the votes of unaffiliated voters and Democrats. This plan focuses on a narrow political agenda rather than keeping communities together, unfair to citizens, to minorities, and to democracy. Good plans have been submitted that keep communities together. (Utah Citizens Counsel Plan A, for example.)

I am with a political action committee called RepresentMeUtah! Our group consists of two Independents, a Republican, a Democrat, a Libertarian and a Constitutionalist. (www.representmeutah.org) We have a plan for immediate action if we can get enough NO votes. Thank you for your message. All of the maps the redistricting committee adopted are on the legislature's website: www.redistrictutah.com. We are in a Special Session right now and I know a number of legislators are preparing alternative maps. I cannot predict what will actually be proposed or pass during the next few days.

The Congressional map adopted by the Redistricting Committee has you in the district that Congressman Matheson lives in. The map adopted by the Redistricting Committee for the Utah House still has me living in the same House district that you live in. The issue, however, should not be about me or any other legislator. Dear Friends,

This Friday may be the last opportunity for public input on Utah's new U.S. Congressional Maps! We made a difference last night by citizens showing up and asking the Legislature to hold off until public input, now we need you to come to the Capitol Friday and give your input. At 9 a.m., we hope you and everyone will fill up the seats in the Capitol's Room 445, and hopefully with so many of us, we will flow into the hallways to have the chance to voice our opinions.

We have a plan to maximize the impact with all the people that show up...

We are asking the Legislature for compromise.

A compromise map first submitted by Senator Ben McAdams on Tuesday was rejected, but few citizens were there to show support. We would like to support this map as revised on Friday. If we can get twenty, forty, sixty, eighty people to attend, here's the plan:

First, check out McAdams' map: <http://www.redistrictutah.com/maps/congress-sen-mcadams-06-10411>

This map may be disappointing for everyone that wanted a donut hole map. We know. We're disappointed.

Senator McAdams is disappointed. But he drew this map with Republicans in a bipartisan effort. It conforms to the Republican urban/rural mix, yet doesn't sacrifice SL County. It keeps many more cities together than the front running Senate and House plans, including cities in Salt Lake and Utah Counties.

So here's what we're thinking:

Kelli Lundgren from RepresentMeUtah! will go up to the podium first when they ask for public comment on McAdams' map. She will thank the redistricting committee for giving the public one more opportunity to comment. She then holds up a copy of McAdam's map, signed on the bottom by herself. She then states, "Compromise is good politics and is what democracy is all about. Accept this map for the good of all citizens. Please vote for this map in the Senate and House. Please do it so we can all move on. Represent Me Utah!
