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

Redistricting

WHY WE REDISTRICT

The process has its root in the Constitutional Convention of 1787. Since greater populations result in more representation in Congress, this is a highly anticipated event in political circles. Utah narrowly missed out on gaining a 4th seat during

the 2000 census (resulting in a U.S. Supreme Court case involving how LDS missionaries or other residents residing out of country like the military are counted during the census). The results of the 2010 census revealed that Utah's population had grown enough to warrant a 4th Congressional seat.

HOW THE PROCESS WORKS

Once a 4th seat was allocated to Utah, the legislature created a redistricting committee made up of State Representatives, State Senators, Republicans and Democrats. The committee traveled the State visiting 17 different cities gathering public input and listening to the peoples' concerns regarding the boundaries to be created by the process. The public was very engaged and most meetings were well attended with many people wanting to offer comments.

DRAWING MAPS

While the Congressional maps usually draw the most attention from the public, the redistricting committee is responsible for 4 different map categories: State House, State Senate, State School Board, and Congressional. The shifts and changes in population will eventually trickle all the way down to City Council boundaries as all political entities adjust to ensure that every district has equal populations.

In contrast to past cycles, at the local meetings anyone who had drawn a map had the chance to present to the committee. The base map for State School Board was one drawn by Rob Horner, an interested citizen from Logan. Public ideas and input from citizen maps were used to flesh out the details of the other redistricting maps.

STATE HOUSE

The State House of Representatives has 75 seats that needed to be adjusted to follow the population shifts. Certain areas of the State have grown faster than others, like St. George, southwest Salt Lake County and northwest Davis County. Our district shifted somewhat, gaining voters in Syracuse and losing voters in central Layton and south Kaysville to other districts. This map passed with a vote of 71-1 in the House and 26-1 in the Senate. I hate to see the residents I've had the opportunity to represent go to other districts, but they will be in good hands with my colleagues.

CONGRESSIONAL MAPS - WHY I VOTED 'NO'...

Due to the gain of a 4th Congressional seat and a decade of steady population growth, a major redraw was necessary. This process is not nearly as easy as it might seem. There are many important principles like equal population, respecting community boundaries and community of interest, and clear and contiguous boundaries. Complicating the process is the way the majority of our population has grouped together along the Wasatch Front. This means there would be multiple lines drawn through the major population centers, which would divide cities, counties, and neighboring communities. We knew going into the process that it would be hard to draw lines through the urban core without upsetting some. Rural Utah has many less dividing lines because the populations is significantly lower and so those lines are much less controversial.

The final map took several (long) days to debate and compromise between the full House and Senate. The final map pulls a significant chunk of southern Davis County into the 2nd District. Previously those some citizens had been in the 1st District. All of the district I represent in the State House will remain in District 1, but you will want to check your address against the final map because the line between Districts 1 and 2 is between Farmington (2nd District) and Kaysville (1st District). A small group of homes in the Hess Farms area of Kaysville was pulled out of District 1 into District 2. On this vote, I went against the party and voted 'no'. I felt the last minute change to pull part of Kaysville into the 2nd District was not something I could support.

This map passed with a vote of 50-19 in the House and 20-5 in the Senate.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, since the adjournment of the 2011 General Session of the Fifty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Utah, matters have arisen that require immediate legislative attention;


WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Utah provides that the Governor may, by proclamation, convene the Legislature into Special Session; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Gary R. Herbert, Governor of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Utah, call the Fifty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Utah into a Third Special Session at the Utah State Capitol, in Salt Lake City, Utah, on the 3rd day of October 2011, at 9:00 a.m., for the following purposes:


- (1) to divide the state into congressional, legislative and other districts pursuant to Utah Constitution Article IX and to address related matters;
- (2) to consider amendments to the Utah Labor Code to address requirements related to workers' compensation insurance for owners of certain entities and to make technical and related changes;
- (3) to consider amendments to the Elections Code to modify the requirements for placing presidential candidates on the regular primary ballot and to make technical and related changes;
- (4) to consider amendments to the Uniform Driver License Act to modify provisions relating to the driver license suspension period and other sentencing requirements for certain alcohol or drug related offenses and to make technical and related changes;
- (5) to consider amendments to the State System of Higher Education Code to modify the requirements for the appointment of representatives of less populous counties to the Board of Regents and to make technical and related changes;
- (6) to consider a concurrent resolution recognizing the 75th Anniversary of the Welfare System of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints;

(7) to consider a concurrent resolution urging Utah's Congressional delegation to resolve the Scofield land transfer issue.

**Redistricting State Senate Districts
Plan Highlights:**

I was motivated to create this map after discovering the city where I live, Clinton, was divided between 2 Senate Districts on the Legislature's Redistricting Committee's adopted Senate Base Map. As I investigated further, I found that by adjusting a few lines, I was able to keep many Northern Davis County cities together, not just my own. The new map:

- Keeps Clinton, Clearfield, Sunset, Farmington, West Point, Syracuse, and Roy together.
- The original Senate Base Map divided those living on Hill Air Force Base into 2 districts, with the base homes in one district, and the barracks in another. This revised map puts all of Hill Air Force Base and the coming Falcon Hill Development all in the same district.
- The cities of Kaysville and Layton are now divided down the I-15 corridor, the most logical division.
- The districts are still all relatively the same size: the largest district has a .12% deviation from the goal (+118 people, the HAFB/I-84 Corridor District), and the smallest district has a -.12% deviation from the goal (-110 people, the East Layton/Antelope Island District).
