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Dear Utah Legislator:

I'm writing to protest the current redistricting plan. The notion that rural and urban districts should be 'blended' is absurd, as it results in districts that represent neither set of interests well. And in this case, it seems specially designed to silence the voice of the most populous area in the state -- Salt Lake County. As a resident of Salt Lake County, which is now split into four districts, I can assure you that I personally feel totally disenfranchised by the current plan. Specifically, I now reside in the newly formed District 4, drawn by all accounts to ensure the election of Rep Carl Wimmer to Congress. He does not and never will reflect my positions on issues that affect me personally or, more broadly, this country, Utah, or Salt Lake County. Representation is more than one-person-one vote. It also involves ensuring that areas of mutual interest are left intact such that they have a collective voice that can be heard. Salt Lake County will be deprived of that representation in Congress, should you adopt the plan before you.

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Dear Representative or Senator:

I am pleased that the legislature has 'stepped back to take another look' relative to redistricting, as it was clear from the map under consideration at that time did not represent the concerns of many Utah citizens. That is, the map did not keep communities of interest intact in any meaningful sense of the word. Specifically, the 'pizza slice' approach to Salt Lake County completely disenfranchised that population by carving it into four pieces and linking three to rural areas with enough population to overpower the urban voice.

Unfortunately, it appears that the 'revised' plan, developed behind closed doors and without public input only worsens the situation by linking the new District 4 to rural areas as well. This approach serves no one well -- urban or rural -- and represents a total travesty that can only be described as blatant gerrymandering for partisan gain. The comments of Becky Lockhart and others chastising questioners who dared suggest that this approach disenfranchised voters and weakened democracy by replying that 'this is a Republic' (don't you know stupid) and 'no Republican or Democrat' will be deprived of a vote under this plan' only underscores the blatant disregard of this legislature for those you are supposed to represent and a lack of understanding of many prior court rulings that underscore the importance of preserving communities of interest in order to protect the ability of those groups to be effectively heard. Additionally, claims that you 'listened to the public' have been nullified by your subsequent redrawing of the lines behind closed doors and the destruction by some members of email communications relevant to the process. Prior to this, efforts to silence the voice of Utahns by creating impossibly high barriers to citizen petitions only further underscores this disregard. The voices of the many thousands who signed a petition asking for an independent redistricting commission have been ignored. I am confident that, had the bar not been set quite so high and had online signatures been acceptable, the initiative would have been on the ballot and would have passed.

Please astonish me and truly step back far enough to consider and implement a plan that does not disenfranchise the urban majority population of this state. We will be heard -- if not now, at the ballot box come November.

I consider myself to be a Republican. But it seems to me the latest redistricting plan in favor with Republicans is a bad deal for rural Utahns, and is only being done to hurt the chances of Democrats in elections rather than providing the best representation possible for each person in Utah.

I used to live in Eureka. We were in the same Congressional District as Tooele (50 miles away) and Ogden (100 miles away). Eureka is just a few miles away from towns in southern Utah County, and our county seat in Nephi, but we were in a different Congressional District. What on earth does Eureka have with Ogden? What do people living in rural central or western Utah have with large cities on the Wasatch Front? But there we were, represented in the State Legislature and in Congress by someone who could ignore us (and frequently did) because the votes were in the larger cities.

Now I live in Tooele, a substantially larger town. But the problem is still going to exist. I urge you to stand up and support equal representation by supporting ANY redistricting plan that puts rural Utahns together and are not lumped into districts with larger cities just to get the numbers within the 1% and 3.5% deviations allowed. Rural Utah, even Tooele, has different issues, different problems, and different economies than Salt Lake County, or Ogden, or Provo.

There have been several articles saying the Legislature prefers a "pizza" plan for Utah's 4 Congressional districts. When you convene next week, if you must choose one of these pizza plans, the one I support and would vote for is the plan titled Congress: Senator Okerlund Plan "F". Of the finalist plans for Congress, the one I think should be passed is one of the so-called "donut" plans titled Congress: Representative Harper 02.

For me, there are 2 imperative subjects that must be considered and used for Utah's congressional districts:

- 1) Keep the whole of Utah County within a single district.
- 2) Keep the Salt Lake Democrat vote within Salt Lake County. **DO NOT** let their voice and vote dominate the voices and votes of the rural Utahns in Vernal or Moab or even St George.

## **Governor Calls Special Session for Monday**

Salt Lake City – Just after noon today, Governor Gary R. Herbert signed a proclamation convening the Utah Legislature in a Special Session to address seven legislative issues next Monday, October 3, at 9:00 a.m.

“Redistricting is an important responsibility that the Utah Constitution assigns to the Legislature. Several other issues have come to my attention which I have added to the call for the Legislature to consider while they are in special session. These are, in large measure, technical and clean-up amendments to state law.”

Among the items the Governor has asked the Legislature to consider are: changes to workers’ compensation insurance requirements; modifications to the requirement that certain members of the Board of Regents represent less populous counties; and adding the presidential primary to the regular primary ballot.
