We live in a digital age and world. Who even uses paper when you have an iPad you can carry around with you? It seems only fitting that the Utah Legislature would follow suit. For as long as any of us can remember, paper Bills enact statute. Paper Bills are passed and signed. However, for the first time in Utah, and possibly the first time in the Country, the Utah State Legislature is actually passing an electronic component of the Bill.

Redistricting occurs every ten years and in an effort to provide better access and details at such a crazy time, the Bills will contain both a paper and digital component. The state of Utah is split into 115,000 census blocks. Through this new innovative technology these blocks are listed and then assigned to a district. This has been extremely beneficial to both the public and the Legislature.

Although every traditional Bill has been posted online for the public, this new technology allows the public to view the redistricting maps in much greater detail. This is because each and every census block can be viewed. You can literally zoom in until you see only one census block – whether it's a city block in Salt Lake City or a railroad in Panguitch. As long as you have access to internet, you are able to view the maps in as great of detail as you choose. However, even if you don't have access to the internet, the maps are available on computers inside the Capitol.

Not only is this new technology an example of how innovative our State Legislature is becoming, it also shows how important public involvement is regarding redistricting. Public involvement and knowledge is key in the passing of these Bills. It is clear that the State is making public access of utmost importance.

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I was asked by a state legislature to query the NCSL redistricting listserv about the format for enacting redistricting plans. NCSL's redistricting law book 2010 has a table on page 152 showing whether states enacted paper descriptions of plans in a meets/bounds, list of census units, or printed map format--or some combination of those. The question is whether any state has adopted "electronic" versions of plans by referencing a specific digital map file posted on a specific date and housed in perpetuity in a computer file with a designated state authority? Can you let me know if your state has done this either this year or ten years ago, or whether you intend to do it in this redistricting cycle?
