





This is pretty much the definition of gerrymandering. That little tiny isthmus going through Salt Lake City is OBVIOUSLY designed to throw in any Democratic support there and in Park City into a large rural district, with the sole intention of creating a safer Republican seat, with very little regard for keeping communities of interest together. Why else would the Avenues be, yet again, merged into the same district as rural areas like Juab, Sanpete, Piute, and San Juan counties? What could these two very different styles of communities have in common?

This is about the worst implementation of a "donut hole" plan I've seen, with this district classically gerrymandered as well. Think about this in the sense of keeping communities intact. Which option makes more sense: (1) This map, where a strange, grotesque-looking portion of south-western Salt Lake County is merged with Saratoga Springs and the rest of the western shore of Utah Lake, wrapping around to include Santaquin and Payson. Or (2) a concise, entirely-within-Salt Lake County "donut hole," keeping the similar urban communities together to be represented by someone who knows and can represent those issues, while allowing the Utah County portion to combine with the rest of the county.

Do the people of Goshen and Elberta truly belong in the exact same district as West Valley City and portions of South Salt Lake? Does this make any geographical or cultural sense?

What would make MUCH more sense all around would be to merge the Utah County portion of the gerrymandered "donut hole" with the southwestern green district (sorry, the map doesn't have District Numbers as far as I can tell), and create a better "dount hole" by giving the SL County portions to the




