The "Donut Hole" district does what proponents hoped it would: make an all-urban district in Salt Lake County to give it its own voice (though, like I said, the exact boundaries of this Donut Hole aren't perfect, it's something I can live with just fine).

The eastern district (either 3 or 4, not sure) does a great job, combining the rest of SL County with Park City (something both communities have wanted for years), and includes the eastern portion of the state, rather similar to parts of the current 2nd district.

Finally, the last district is fantastic. It is EXACTLY what rural Utah has been begging for: an (almost) all-rural district that allows them to elect a representative to represent their very specific issues separately from the urban issues.

This map is a million times better than the committee-passed one, and I hope the legislature actually gives it a look rather than just voting it down without a thought; it is much more in tune with the will of the Utahn people than the gerrymandered Sumsion map.


