No one in the legislature should have thought this was a good idea. They didn't need Jim Debakis's letter to know a suit was coming and that they should not delete records. I doubt that "attorneys told him to delete early and often" particularly concerning this crucial aspect of state business --looming lawsuit or not. In any event those emails aren't as deleted as he thinks. I'd bet they could be retrieved from servers right now. Ditto text messages and word documents. I do think we need experienced redistricting experts, constitutional law lawyers to mount the suit and some of the usual think tanks and civil liberties organizations in DC may be able to supply free assistance, but perhaps local counsel should be enlisted right now to get order preventing servers, individual computer hard drives, etc from being wiped. You two have much more recent litigation experience; I don't know or remember much about the technical (IT) aspects of this but in commercial civil litigation I know this stuff is never gone just because an individual user deletes it thoughts for the moment. Lisa, I have to write after reading tonight's Des News story about the redistricting committee hearing today as well as watching KSL's version of the 10:00 hearing tonight. Where did anyone get the idea that the committee voted on its final version of the Congressional map today? That is simply not accurate. The Speaker introduced for the first time today a significantly modified version of Sumsion 6. The vote that we took today was to move that modified map, Sumsion 6 Modified A, along for continued discussion on Thursday morning. In fact, Democrats on the committee anticipate moving for passage on Thursday an alternative map that we believe more fairly reflects sound redistricting principles and fairly provides for representation of Utah citizens for the next ten years. But the only thing that Des News readers and KSL TV watchers would think after reading and watching tonight's stories is that the redistricting committee's work is done and that all the Democrats on the committee except one voted for a map that outraged other sane Democrats across the state. That is fundamentally wrong. By comparison, Lee Davidson's story on today's events in the Tribune states that today's meeting moved the process of winnowing down the maps along but that the committee's final vote on the Congressional map will not occur until Thursday. Between now and then the public will have an opportunity to review the Sumsion 6 Modified A map and provide additional input. Mr. Davidson's story provides a link for the public to view the Sumsion 6 Modified A map and invites their input. Please take a look at the last three paragraphs of his story. Does the fact that tomorrow provides the last chance for the public to weigh in and provide input to the redistricting committee not matter to the Des News and KSL? There was no ambiguity about the Speaker's motion. No one on the committee was confused. It was clearly a PROCEDURAL vote, not a substantive vote. No one felt they were voting to pass out of the committee a base Congressional map. Of course, the problem isn't that I'm confused or that anyone else on the committee will be confused after reading your story and hearing KSL's version of the committee hearings today. We were there and know what we did and did not do. But citizens across the state will certainly have the wrong impression of where we're at in the process after reading the Des News story and watching KSL tonight. Are the Des News and KSL even going to report on Thursday's committee hearing? Based on what is in tonight's stories, one would think there is really nothing more to say. But that is far from the truth. Lisa, I don't want to overreact. But these stories create a significant misimpression as to what happened today in the redistricting committee meeting. More important, these stories give the impression that the opportunity for public input to the redistricting committee about Sumsion 6 Modified A has come and gone. That is not accurate. I ask that you promptly correct both the Des News and the KSL stories. Brian
